**GROSS ABUSE OF OUR FUNDAMENTAL HUMAN RIGHTS BY THE  
PARAMOUNT CHIEF AND CHIEFDOM AUTHORITIES OF MALEN  
CHIEFDOM, PUJEHUN DISTRICT, SOUTHERN PROVINCE OF THE  
REPUBLIC OF SIERRA LEONE**

I hereby write for and on behalf of the land holding families of Malen Chiefdom who are affected by the operations of the Socfin Agricultural Company in the Malen Chiefdom, Pujehun District, Southern Province of the Republic of Sierra Leone to complain to you about the blatant disregard and abuse of our fundamental human rights to wit unlawful occupation of our family land by the Socfin agricultural Company.

It all started in early 2011 when the Paramount Chief of the Malen Chiefdom summoned all the section chiefs and town chiefs and informed them about the Government of Sierra Leone's intention to recultivate the Sierra Leone Produce Marketing Board Oil palm plantation located in the chiefdom for further agricultural investment by a company. The chiefs were then given sums of money as "shake hand" and further requested to sign documents which were not properly explained to them. Soon afterwards landholding families were informed about the operations of the Socfin Agricultural Company and that a committee had been set up by the Paramount Chief to plot out land upon which the Company was to operate.

Land holding family heads and chiefs who protested against the incursion were molested and harassed by the Paramount Chief, Company personnel and the Police. This led to the arrest of about 40 persons in Kortumahun village, who were brought to Pujehun and later to Bo in October 2011. They were detained for few days and later released after 15 persons were charged to court. Through the intervention of a son of the soil who was the Honourable Member of

Parliament, Hon. Shiaka Sama, we received the help of some human right NGOs and the services of a human right lawyer. The case is still pending in court with little progress made as the prosecution is delaying in closing its case.

The harassment of landholding family members since then has continued and the land had been forcefully taken by the Socfin Agricultural Company for their operations with no regards to the persistence protest from the various landholding family members. Vast farm lands and cash crops of family members in the various villages have been destroyed and continue to be destroyed by the Socfin Agricultural Company in the Malen Chiefdom.

Through the Hon. Sam and with the help of some human right NGOs several meetings were held with the stakeholders including the chiefdom authorities, the Pujehun District Council, the Socfin Management and even the office of the Honourable Vice President which yielded no fruit. The Company has continued its operations with the authority of the Paramount Chief without regard to their protest and demands made for renegotiation on issues relating to the forceful operations of the company on our family land.

Recently, four of our members were arrested at Basaleh and charged to court by the Police for resisting to allow the Company personnel to operate on their land. These four had no trial in court and were summarily sentenced to imprisonment or fine of Le 3,200,000.00. They were imprisoned for 48days and released only after the Honourable Member of Parliament then paid the fine to the Court.

We are at present under constant harassment from the Paramount chief of the Chiefdom, P.C. Victor Brima Kebbie who threatens that with his APC government in power and Honourable. Shiaka Sama no more in his way as he lost the 2012 election, he can even kill anyone who resists the operations of the company upon any land in the Malen Chiefdom.

It is in this regard that the landholding families affected by the Socfin operations and those to be affected have unanimously resolved to peacefully resist the Socfin Agricultural Company's operation henceforth and not to allow any further operations on any part of their land in the Malen Chiefdom. Attached is the copy of the resolutions.

We are aware of the need to consolidate the hard earned peace we are now enjoying in our beloved country Sierra Leone and further mindful of the need to foster development initiatives in every part of the country


However, the present operations of the Socfin Agricultural Company are against our progress, our livelihood and the economic viability of our families. It is also a blatant disregard to our ownership of our respective family land in the Malen Chiefdom which we can no longer accept.



We are therefore calling on you for your timely intervention so as not to resort to what happened at Feregbeya in the Tonkolili District, Northern Province of Sierra Leone sometime this year.

**MALEN CHIEFDOM LAND HOLDING FAMILIES**

**RESOLUTIONS**

WHEREAS we the under mentioned landholding family members are natives and indigenes of Malen Chiefdom in the Pujehun District, Southern Province of the Republic of Sierra Leone;

WHEREAS we own portions of land with demarcated boundaries in our towns and villages in the Malen chiefdom;

WHEREAS these portions of land inherited from our parents, relations and forefathers of the land are cultivated for subsistence farming and cash crop production for crops such as Oil Palm, Cola nut, Coffee, pineapples, etc which have been the major sources of income and livelihood for our families;

AND WHEREAS the Paramount Chief and chiefdom authorities of the Malen Chiefdom have leased large portions of land including ours to Government of Sierra Leone who in turn have sub-leased the said land to the Socfin Agricultural Company without our informed consent;

REALISING that the activities of the Socfin Agricultural Company has now deprived and continues to deprive us of our land and all the cash crops on it without adequate compensation;

FURTHER REALISING that our members who have refused to give up their land for the company's operation are under constant threat from the Paramount Chief and the chiefdom authorities;



















MINDFUL of the fact that some of our members have been arrested, charged to court and imprisoned and some are still before the Magistrate Court in Pujehun on charges relating to their lawful resistance to give up their land for the company's operations;

WE THE UNDERMENTIONED HEADS OF FAMILIES WITH THE CONSENT OF OUR RESPECTIVE FAMILY MEMBERS AT A MEETING HELD ON SATURDAY 1<sup>ST</sup> DECEMBER 2012 IN PUJEHUN TOWN, PUJEHUN DISTRICT, SOUTHERN SIERRA LEONE HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOW:

1. That we entirely disassociate ourselves from any lease agreement signed by the Paramount Chief and the chiefdom authorities of Malen Chiefdom, Pujehun District, Southern Sierra Leone with the government of Sierra Leone in respect of our land.
2. That we shall no longer allow the Socfin Agricultural Company personnel and or their machines to enter upon and operate on our land
3. That we are open for discussion on the issues relating to the unlawful acquisition of our land by the Socfin Agricultural Company.

WE ARE THEREFORE CALLING ON ALL CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANIZATIONS, THE NATIONAL HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION AND THE UNITED NATIONS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR THEIR TIMELY INTERVENTION IN THIS MATTER.









